OBITUARY - Mr. J.Q. Ewens, CMG, CBE, Q.C.

Mr. John Ewens, formerly First Parliamentary Counsel of the Commonwealth, died in Canberra in August 1992 at the age of 85 years. He was born in Adelaide in November 1907. He attended St. Peter's College between 1920 and 1925 and took his law degree at the University of Adelaide, winning the Roby Fletcher Prize for Logic and the Stow Prize in Law. After a period of articles, he was admitted to the legal profession of South Australia in December 1929 and practised for a short time in Adelaide. However, the South Australian Attorney-General, Sir Shirley Jeffries, suggested that he should apply to the Attorney-General's Department in Canberra for a vacancy created by Sir Robert Garran's retirement. John Ewens was appointed to the post in 1933 from about 70 applicants. He was to boast: "I succeeded Garran. He went out at the top; I came in at the bottom." But he did not remain at the bottom long. He worked within the Department on the many legal problems of peace and war during the 1930's and 1940's. In 1944 the position of Assistant Parliamentary Draftsman was created for him. In 1948 he became Parliamentary Draftsman succeeding, in 1970, to the new post of First Parliamentary Counsel. He retired from that office in 1972 at the age of 65. To it he brought a great felicity in plain English expression, a brilliance in logic and deep knowledge of the law.

After his retirement, John Ewens embarked upon a new career as a consultant - drawing upon his lifetime's devotion to drafting Federal statutes. He advised the Commonwealth Secretariat in London on the drafting needs of newly-independent countries. He drafted the National Compensation Bill for the Woodhouse Inquiry and the Federal Companies Bill for the Whitlam Government. Neither was enacted; but the latter influenced subsequent Federal drafts.

In 1978 John Ewens was appointed part-time Commissioner of the Australian Law Reform Commission. Thereafter, he took part in many projects of that Commission and helped establish its facility in legislative drafting. In 1979 the 50th Anniversary of his admission to the legal profession was celebrated within the Commission in the presence of the then Governor-General, Sir Zelman Cowen, who had served for a time with John Ewens as a Commissioner (see [1980] *Reform* 31). In 1984 the new Federal Attorney-General, Senator Evans, also a past Law Reform Commissioner announced Mr. Ewens' appointment as Queen's Counsel for the Australian Capital Territory. This belated professional recognition was prized by him, being added to other high civil honours which had earlier recognised his role in government and in law. In 1988, the *Adelaide Law Review* Association sponsored a collection of *Essays on Legislative Drafting* in his honour to which notable lawyers in Australia contributed. One contribution was offered by Sir Geoffrey Palmer, later Prime Minister of New Zealand, who had worked with John Ewens in the Woodhouse Inquiry.

John Ewens was the authentic Australian Federal lawyer. He worked closely with all of the Australian Prime Ministers remained open-minded, creative and blunt-speaking to the last. When, in the Law Reform Commission, his eyes first fell upon the word processor, his joy was endless. For the drafting and redrafting of statutes, the new invention was nothing short of a miracle. "What I could have done with this!", he exclaimed. Yet without it his achievements were great and enduring. Many of them still affect the way in which the Australian Federation has grown and is governed.

GENERAL INFORMATION

Official Airline

The Conference enjoys the generous support of CYPRUS AIRWAYS which is the official airline for the Conference. Registrants are recommended to include Cyprus Airways in their travel arrangements, where possible.

Passports and Visas

All persons arriving in Cyprus should hold a valid passport. Visas are not required for any Commonwealth citizens.

Travel Insurance/Loss of Deposit

It is recommended that you obtain comprehensive travel insurance.

Cancellations and Refunds

Registration Fees

90% of registration fees paid will be refunded if notice of cancellation is received in writing prior to 15 March 1993. After this date, refunds will not be made. However you are welcome to provide a replacement in lieu of your attendance.

Driving Licence Requirements

A current International or approved overseas licence is required.

Telecommunications

Telecommunications, are excellent in Cyprus. Indeed, the island's telecommunications system is one of the most advanced and efficient in the world. Contact with foreign countries is mainly maintained through satellite and submarine cables.

Most countries can be reached on a fully automatic direct dialling system on a 24 hour basis from any telephone on the island. More than 200 countries are connected on the Cyprus International Automatic Telex exchange and can be reached on a fully automatic direct dialling system from any telex in Cyprus.

A telegraph service also connects Cyprus with every part of the world. There are also efficient facsimile and Datel services as well as radiotelegraph and radio-telephone services with ships at sea on a 24 hour basis.

Furthermore, the authority offers an extensive range of modern and efficient services aimed at improving the competitiveness of Cypriot business such as mobile telephony, paging and a packet switched data network. (CYTAPAC)

Credit Cards

All major Credit Cards are readily accepted in hotels and most shops in Cyprus. Credit Cards will also be accepted for registration fees and other Conference items.

Transport

Transport will be provided for registrants between the principal Conference hotels in Nicosia, Larnaca, Limassol and the Nicosia Conference Centre.

Transport will be provided free of charge from hotel to conference at 8.00 a.m. and 10.00 a.m. from Conference Centre to hotels at 2.30 p.m. and 6.30 p.m.

Transport will be also available from Hotels to the Conference Centre on Sunday morning May 2, 1993 for registration purposes.

Weather and Clothing

The Conference will be held during Cyprus Spring. Registrants are advised to bring clothing suitable for temperatures ranging from warm (26° C) to cool (16° C). The emphasis will be on informality; national dress or lounge suits may be worn at some functions, but men will not need to bring dinner suits.

The Cyprus monetary unit is the pound, which is divided into 100 cents. The symbol used externally for a single or plural amount of the local currency is C£.

International time

Cyprus standard time is two hours ahead of Greenwich Mean Time. Clocks are put forward an additional hour from May until September.

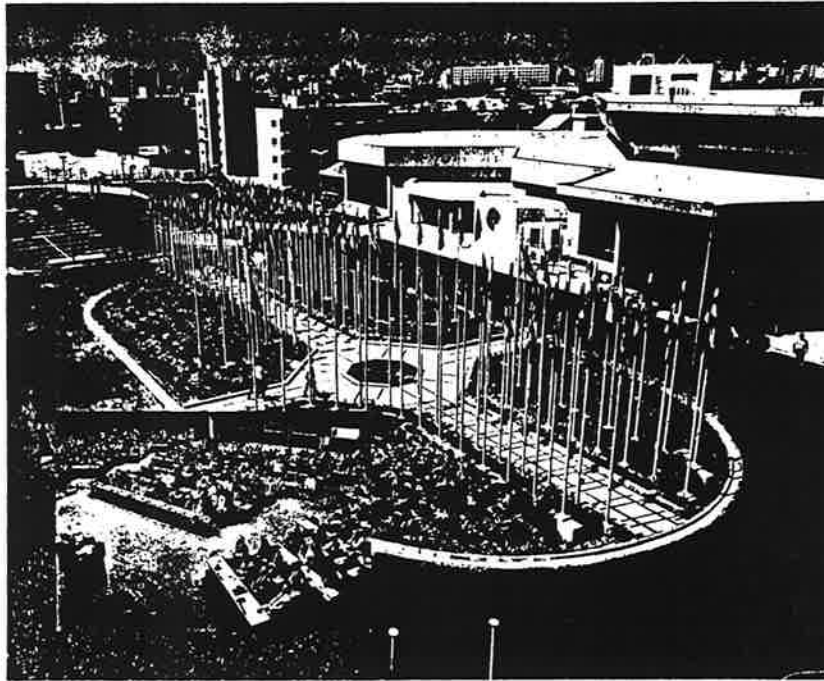
